MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

Nagpur Veterinary College Nagpur MS, India

&

Dadasaheb Balpande College of Pharmacy, Besa, Nagpur, MS, India

for

facilitating

Collaborative Teaching, and Research

This Memorandum of Understanding [herein after referred to as MoU is made on this 24th day of the month of June in the year 2022 by and between the **Dadasaheb Balpande College of Pharmacy** and having its registered office at **Besa, Nagpur** (hereinafter called as **DBCOP**, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the one part,

And

Nagpur Veterinary College (hereinafter called as **NVC**, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns). The Maharashtra Animal & Fishery Sciences University (MAFSU) was formally notified on November 17th, 2000 and was established under the State Act No. 1998 (MAH.XVII of 1998) on December 03rd, 2000 with its headquarter at Nagpur with the mission to ensure enlightenment and empowerment of students by imparting advanced knowledge and research in the fields of animal, dairy and fishery sciences by adopting innovative, efficient and effective strategies, is having registered office at Maharashtra Animal & Fishery Sciences University, Futala Lake Road, Nagpur - 440 001, India.

In the spirit of intellectual co-operation, scholarly exchange, and partnering with leading institutions, **NVC** and **DBCOP**, agrees to establish a program of exchange and collaboration on related matters of mutual interest on multidisciplinary research and teaching.

1. The purpose of the cooperation is to promote collaborative research and to facilitate the exchange of ideas, development of new knowledge and enhance high quality research acumen. The major thrust of the research on which the parties will co-operate is Veterinary Science & Pharmaceutical Sciences. The modes of co-operation will include:
 - a. Visit of faculty and students for the purpose of research and teaching;
 - b. Development and implementation of cooperative research projects, professional development programs, and capacity-building efforts;
 - c. Dissemination of findings through joint scholarly publications.
 - d. Undertaking joint projects, exploit, commercialize and deploy intellectual property developed jointly.
2. To achieve the goals of this cooperation, both parties will
 - a) Promote institutional exchange by inviting faculty and student researchers of the partner institution to participate in appropriate research activities;
 - b) Jointly organize symposia, conferences, and meetings on timely research issues;
 - c) Develop and carry out joint research programs; and
 - d) Exchange information pertaining to the agreed-upon research areas.
3. Prior to the initiation of any particular project or activity, the specific terms of cooperation and exchange for that project will be discussed and agreed upon in writing by the appropriate responsible representatives of both the institutions.
4. Both parties understand that all financial arrangements for specific exchange activities must be mutually agreed upon and will depend on the availability of funds. In addition, the scope of the activities will be subject to funds available at the institutions for the type of collaboration undertaken and any financial assistance that may be obtained by either from external sources.
5. Either party may propose to the other specific individual research projects for collaboration. Such proposal may be made at any time and the parties will develop an agreement for each agreed-upon project.
6. Ownership of any intellectual property, including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights developed jointly during the course of this MoU shall be vested in both the Parties. The expense of filing and maintenance of intellectual property shall be borne jointly by both the parties.
7. Each Party agrees to release and hold the other harmless from and against any claims, damages, liability or costs, to the extent such claims damages, liability or costs do not arise from the negligent or wilful acts or any of its agents or employees in connection with their respective performance under this MoU.
8. All publications in the programmes of co-operation will be co-authored by the concerned staff/Research Fellow of **NVC** and **DBCOP**.
9. Both parties agree that in the course of implementing this MoU, they will not engage in unlawful discrimination on the grounds of race, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, social class, national or ethnic origin or disability.
10. Amendments to this MoU can be made at any time after consultation and agreement between the two institutions. Any such amendment must be done in writing and signed by both the parties.

11. This MoU will remain in force initially for a period of 5 (five) years from the date it is fully executed. The MoU can also be suitably modified, as agreed to by both the parties, to reflect an increased scope, nature of engagement /activities. In addition, either party may terminate the MoU in advance of its normal expiration by providing the other Party with three months' prior written notice. In this case, persons already approved as exchange participants will be allowed to complete their exchange visits under the conditions specified at the time of their invitation to the host institution.
12. Any dispute between the parties arising from this Agreement shall firstly be settled amicably through negotiations and dialogue in good faith, failing which the same shall be referred to Arbitration at the head office of MAFSU, Nagpur only and shall be settled by Arbitration which shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of (Indian) Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or any subsequent amendment thereof and the language shall be English. The Award shall be final and binding upon the Parties. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws in India. Each party shall bear and pay its own cost of arbitration proceedings. The provision of this clause shall not become in-operative notwithstanding this agreement expires or ceases to exist or is terminated or revoked.
13. This MOU is intended only to set forth the general understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter herein, and does not, and is not intended to, contractually bind the parties.
14. The Parties shall sign two (2) originals of this MOU in the English language. Each Party shall retain one (1) original.
15. All specific programs or projects undertaken pursuant to this MOU will be subject to mutual periodic evaluation by each Party's appropriate stakeholders.
16. Neither Party may use the name, logo, or mark of the other in any promotional or advertising material (including but not limited to website postings, public announcements and program brochures) without the prior written consent of the other Party according to each Party's policies.
