POST COVID COMPLICATION: MUCORMYCOSIS

The novel coronavirus (CoV) was first identified in Wuhan, China, in December 2019 among a group of patients that shown an unidentified form of viral pneumonia with common history of visiting a seafood market.^{1,2} Later the disease was named Coronavirus Disease-2019 (COVID-19).3 Since then, the virus has spread all over the world causing an huge number of hospitalizations and fatalities in many countries. The

World Health Organization (WHO) declared COVID-19 pandemic as a global public health emergency on January 30, 2020.

COVID-19 is caused by a virus named Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome-Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), which is a member of β-CoVs. The CoV family is a class of enveloped, single-stranded RNA viruses that can cause respiratory, gastrointestinal, hepatic, and neurologic diseases.⁵

COVID-19 can cause five different outcomes: asymptomatic infection; mild to moderate cases that often resolve within 2 weeks; severe cases; critical cases; and death. Older people and those with comorbidities like cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease, and cancer are more likely to develop serious illness. There is no definitive therapy against SARS-CoV-2 yet. Although positive treatment outcomes have been reported with antiviral therapy on selected patients, supportive care and oxygen supplementation remain as the mainstay of the management of COVID-19. The search for therapeutic agents against the virus is underway in many parts of the world. 10-14 The different vaccines are now available and showing the better protection against COVID-19 infection. vaccines are Preventive measures have been forwarded by WHO as major ways of mitigating the outbreak.

The best way to prevent and slow down transmission is to be well informed about the COVID-19 virus, the disease it causes and how it spreads. Protect yourself and others from infection by washing your hands with soap or using an alcohol based sanitizer rub frequently and do not touch hands to the face. & cover the face by face mask. The COVID-19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes, so it's important that you also practice respiratory etiquette (for example, by coughing into a flexed elbow).

The COVID-19 has death rate of 3.0 %, it indicated that the most of the patients get recovered from the disease. But this is not the end of the problems so many peoples who got recovered from this disease has to face the severe health issues and mucormycosis is one of them.

What is Mucormycosis?

Mucormycosis is a fungal infection that mainly infects people who are on medication for other health problems that reduces their ability to fight environmental pathogens. Now a days in India and all over the world the cases of Mucormycosis suddenly increases and most of the patient who are recovered from COVID-19 are found to be susceptible to this infection. Sinuses and lungs of such individuals are affected when these fungal spores are inhaled from the air. This infection can also enter in body through open wounds.

What are the common symptoms?

This can lead to serious disease with warning signs and symptoms depend on which part of the body is involved as follows.

- Pain and redness around eyes and /or nose
- Fever
- Headache
- Coughing
- Shortness of breath
- Bloody vomits
- Altered mental status

The Causes of disease

- Uncontrolled diabetes mellitus
- Immunosupression by steroids
- Prolonged stay in ICU
- Co-morbidities- post transplant/ malignancy
- Voriconazole therapy

Infections Can be Prevented by

- Wear the mask if you are visiting dusty construction site
- Wear shoes, long trousers, long sleeve shirts and gloves while handling soil (gardening), moss or manure
- Maintain personal hygiene including through scrub bath

When to suspect by COVID-19 patients

If the patient recovered from COVID-19 and if the following types of symptoms are seen, it indicates the mucormycosis infection.

- Sinusitis- nasal blockade or congestion, nasal discharge (blackish/bloody), local pain on the chick bone.
- One sided facial pain, numbness or swelling
- Blackish discoloration over bridge of nose/palate
- Toothache, loosening of teeth, jaw involvement
- Blurred or double vision with pain, fever, skin lesion, thrombosis, necrosis.
- Chest pain, pleural effusion, haemoptysis, worsening of respiratory symptoms.

Precautions to be taken

- Control hyperglycemia
- Monitor blood glucose level post COVID-19 discharge and also in diabetics
- Use steroid judiciously correct timing, correct dose and duration
- Use clean, sterile water for humidifiers during oxygen therapy
- Use antibiotics/antifungal judiciously
- Keep watch on warning signs and symptoms
- If symptoms are appeared immediately consult the physician

Management of Disease

- Reduce steroids (if patient is still on) with aim to discontinue rapidly
- Discontinue immunomodulating drugs
- No antifungal prophylaxis needed
- Extensive Surgical Debridement to remove all necrotic materials
- Medical treatment
- Install peripherally inserted central catheter (PICC line)
- Maintain adequate systemic hydration
- Infuse Normal saline IV before Amphotericin B infusion
- Antifungal Therapy, for at least 4-6 weeks (see the guidelines below)
- Monitor patients clinically and with radio-imaging for response and to detect disease progression If proper treatment and precautions are taken mucormycosis is manageable and curable disease.
